

Hook: Children will examine a range of artefacts from Ancient Egypt in a class museum- they will draw and discuss the items to investigate what they tell us about the Egyptians.

Rationale: Children will learn about the fascinating and rich history of the Egyptian people at the time of the Great Pharaohs. They will learn about mummification, gods and goddesses, what jobs were available and everyday life. Not forgetting of course hieroglyphics, pyramids and the importance of the River Nile. In English they will write comic strips based on a scene from the book 'The Ancient Egypt Sleepover' by Stephen Davies and create a report about the day in the life of an Egyptian.

Outcome: The children will be tour guides of an Egyptian Museum filled with their handmade artefacts.

Focus Area: History, children will learn:

Pupils will learn about the achievements of the earliest civilizations and will be given an overview of where and when the first civilizations appeared. They will take part in an in-depth study of the Ancient Egyptian Dynasty. This will include finding out: where and when the Ancient Egyptian civilization began, what everyday life was like at the time, the religious practices of the Ancient Egyptians and the unusual rituals they participated in, such as mummification.

They will have a chance to use different sources of evidence- including artefacts, books, photographs, video footage and the internet to research different aspects and draw conclusion about the life style of the Ancient Egyptians and how it compares to life now.

Art:

Egypt

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Pupils will research Ancient Egyptian art-work. From this they will design their own piece of art work which will be produced as a finished piece using printing techniques.

Music and Dance

Children will listen to traditional music from Egypt and compose and perform their own.

They will watch traditional dancing also from Egypt. This will be the inspiration for their own dances. They will put together their own routines incorporating some of the moves from traditional Egyptian dance and Egyptian inspired yoga moves. They will perform their routines to the class accompanied by the music they have chosen.
