## World Haemophilia Day

On Wednesday it was World Haemophilia Day and we would like to take a minute to spread awareness of this rare disorder. For any of you who don't know, Louie in Reception here at Queensgate has severe Haemophilia A. Haemophilia is a lifelong bleeding disorder in which the blood does not clot properly, or at all. When a person with haemophilia bleeds, it takes longer than normal for the bleeding to stop. This is because people with haemophilia don't produce enough of an important protein that helps the blood to clot, called a 'clotting factor'. Louie has severe haemophilia A. Which means he has less than 1% of the clotting Factor 8 protein in his body, to give you some context a normal person has between 50% and 150%.On Wednesday, Louie gave all his friends in reception haemophilia stickers.
