Here is the letter from Peter.

Dear Parents, Carers and families

Sadly, today we have accepted the resignation of our founder Head with effect from Friday 18th April 2025. It is a bittersweet moment; however, we appreciate that her new role gives Mrs Sillito a chance to advance her educational career, it also allows the Island to retain her services as she heads up the Local Authority Schools' Improvement Team.

We would like to take the opportunity to thank her for her many years of dedicated service to pupils, staff, parents and the Governing Board of Queensgate.

During her time at Queensgate, we have seen many achievements. The creation of an altogether new school, a string of successive good Ofsted results, a vision, a code, a revamped curriculum, out and about, music, a platinum award for School Sport, The Patch, cookery, a new site on the Osborne Middle Site, a new building, strong leadership through the challenging Covid pandemic, and raised attainment for children amongst many others.

The Governing Board will immediately commence a thorough process to recruit a new Head for the School with a view to fill that position by 1st September 2025. It will be a challenge to fill Mrs Sillito's shoes and recruiting a Head to fit the ethical standards and ethos of our amazing school, however we have a strong and fully staffed Board to carry this out along with representation of the Local Authority.

We would also like to thank Mr Robin Chubb and the Senior Leadership Team for taking on additional responsibilities from April, until a new Head is appointed for September. Until April there will be no change and even after that, given our strong leadership team, I can assure you that it will be business as usual.

We will keep you informed and look forward to keeping you in the picture. The post will be advertised this month.

Dear Families,

In 2010 I moved to the Isle of Wight with my young family to start a brand-new school from scratch, bringing two primary schools together to become Queensgate Foundation Primary School. That was over fourteen years ago.

I have absolutely loved being headteacher of Queensgate and am immensely proud of our wonderful achievements over this time, including four good Ofsted Inspections. I am now eager to take my school improvement expertise to the wider Island audience and bring about sustainable change in the Island education system in a new role as Senior School Improvement Team Leader for the Isle of Wight.

I will remain at Queensgate until Friday 4th April 2024. Mr Chubb will take over as Interim Headteacher for the summer term, whilst the Governors recruit for my permanent replacement by 1st September 2025. Mr Chubb will be ably supported by the senior leaders: Mrs Grant, Mr Tilling and Miss Hunter, as well as the fantastic Queensgate staff and Governors.

I would like to assure you that it is business as usual this term with our staff team striving for outstanding education for every single child at Queensgate. As always, I would like to thank you for your continued support.


Please ensure all uniform and swim kit is named to avoid any confusion in the changing rooms.

15-minute lesson = £8


20-minute individual lesson = £10 (violin and piano)

Island Athletics Final


