Year 6 Carnival Cruise Experience

On Thursday 10th July, Year 6 children visited the Isle of Wight College. During the morning, the children were split into three groups for course taster sessions: Group 1 visited the hair and beauty department where they made carnival masquerade masks, followed by creative media where they made a short video. Group 2 learnt about branding and logo's during their business and marketing taster, followed by travel and tourism. Group 3 began with creative media and ended with catering, where they decorated cupcakes ready for the high-seas tea in the afternoon. During these taster sessions the children were able to experience a little bit of college life and see what sort of courses and careers they could do when they are older. During the afternoon, the children took part in a pilot project. The objective of this project was to learn about the different roles on board a cruise ship and the importance of providing high levels of service to guests in a safe and well organised environment. The children were taught about the importance of careful planning, teamwork and high standards when providing complex hospitality experiences. The children formed part of the entertainment team, the shoreside excursion team or the guest experience team. Queensgate Out & About

The children in Year 1 have been learning about lighthouses and the rescue led by a lighthouse-keeper's daughter, Grace Darling, in 1838. On Wednesday morning, the Out and About team visited Alum Bay to see the Needles Lighthouse. The children listened to lighthouse stories and enjoyed exploring the coloured sands from the cliffs.



On Tuesday afternoon, our Year 3 Out and About group had a great time exploring forces at Godshill play park. The children had fun testing out all the play equipment as well as identifying which force (a push or pull) was in action. They worked well in pairs and enjoyed playing with their friends.



In the afternoon, our Year 2 Out and About group hiked from Culver Down to Whitecliff Bay and back. The group checked their heart rate using a Pulse Oximeter before and after their walk, to see the impact exercise had. They discussed why it is important to exercise and learnt that their heart rate had increased to supply oxygenated blood to their muscles. The children used pedometers to count their steps, walking over 2,200 (very steep) steps during the session.

"We went for a long walk near the cliffs down to Whitecliff Bay. We tested how fast our heart was beating at the start and then at the end of the walk to see what happens when we exercise. Our hearts were beating very fast! I enjoyed going onto the beach and finding sea glass." Evelyn

NHS 111 Online & Local Pharmacies

NHS 111 online and local pharmacies can help you get the right care

People with urgent but non-life-threatening medical needs are encouraged to use NHS 111 online to get quick advice and be directed to the most appropriate care, especially over the bank holiday weekend when services are expected to be busy.

NHS 111 online is a fast and easy-to-use alternative to the NHS 111 phone service. It can provide help for people 5 years and over by assessing symptoms, giving advice on what to do next, and connecting people to local services without having to wait on the phone. Whether you need help with a minor injury, mental health support, advice about dental pain, or emergency medication, NHS 111 online is available 24/7. It's especially useful if you can't get a GP appointment or your surgery is closed.

Sophia from Newport recently searched 111.nhs.uk for help when she woke up with red, itchy insect bites after a family BBQ. When they started getting worse, she used NHS 111 online for advice and was directed to her local pharmacy. The pharmacist recommended a cream and gave her tips on managing the symptoms including what to do if the bites got worse.

Sophia said: "I was glad I went online first. A friend suggested I go to hospital but that didn't feel right for a few bites. The pharmacy was exactly what I needed."

Lee Haward, IW Ambulance Service Head of Clinical Coordination Centre, said: "If you've got access to the internet, NHS 111 online is a really quick and easy way to get help. It works just like calling 111, but you can do it all online, anytime, day or night. Just go to the NHS 111 website or use the NHS App, answer a few questions about how you're feeling, and it will guide you to the right care. It's really easy to use and there when you need help."

Pharmacies can help with minor illnesses - Your local pharmacy is also a great source of expert help for minor conditions. As part of the Pharmacy First scheme, many community pharmacies can now offer clinical advice and treatment for common illnesses without the need to see a GP: Sinusitis

Sore throat Earache Infected insect bites Impetigo (a bacterial skin infection) Shingles Uncomplicated urinary tract infections (in women)
