TASK 1; diary writing

Read an extract from this myth (he had 12 tasks in all).

For Hercules 5th labour he had to clean the stables of King Augeas of Elis. After disagreements Hercules destroyed the city of Elis and held the first Olympic Games in honour of his father, Zeus.

He is said to have taught men how to wrestle and measure out the length of the first race. At the first Games, Hercules was the only contestant.

Hercules won all of the running and throwing events. In the boxing and wrestling his father Zeus, who was present at this first Games grappled Hercules to a draw.

Hercules had a busy week- here is what he did ...
