The children in **Reception** are learning about animals this half term. On Tuesday morning the Out and About group visited the Donkey Sanctuary, in Wroxall. 








BEE CREATIVE

Sports at Queensgate

Indoor Athletic

On Friday 26th January, some children from **Year 5** and **6** travelled to Cowes Enterprise College to take part in an Indoor Athletics event with seven other schools from around the Island. The children participated in a range of track and field events, including, triple jump, ball throw and various relays. Everyone tried extremely hard in their individual events and were very supportive of each other during the races. We faced some tough competition, finishing 4th out of eight overall, however we were very proud of our efforts.



Football

On **Monday**, the **Year 5** boys faced Greenmount in their last league game. The boys were very excited going into the game as their previous match had been cancelled due to poor weather. The boys looked sharp in the warm up and took that into the start of the game. During the first half, the boys put Greenmount under immense pressure and managed to grab a goal just before the half time whistle. It was a quick turn around at half time, the boys had a quick drink and got straight back on the pitch. Throughout the second half, Greenmount grew into the game more and more, forcing our goal keeper Artem to make some crucial saves. The game finished 1-0 and the boys had earnt an important 3 points in the league. This was a good performance from the boys, however we will look to score more goals in the next game.

Following Monday's performance, the **Year 5** boys had another game against Lanesend on **Wednesday**. With a few small changes to the team, the boys were confident going into the game. The game began and the boys were first to the ball, scoring after just a couple of minutes. The team kept the tempo high and forced Lanesend back into their own half. We passed the ball round our opponents well and created some great chances. Throughout both halves of the match, the boys worked well as a team to move the ball up the pitch swiftly, whilst also demonstrating good individual skills to score some fantastic goals. The game finished 5-0 to Queensgate. As this was a cup game, the team now progresses to the Semi-finals where they will face Gurnard away. We are hopeful that we can put in a similar performance to this one and have a good chance of reaching the cup final.

Also on **Wednesday**, the **Year 6** boys faced Lanesend in their last league game of the year. The boys were excited going into the game and hopeful that they could end the league campaign on a high. With both the Year 5 and 6 games going on at the same time, I asked some of the Year 6 boys for their comments on the game.

Max E - "It wasn't our strongest performance. We didn't create enough chances although George was unfortunate to not score with the last kick of the game."

George T (goal keeper) - "As we were 3-2 down with seconds left to go, I went forward for a corner. The ball surprisingly fell to me and I almost scored!"

Unfortunately, the team lost the game 3-2, however they will look to improve going into next week's cup game against Ryde.

On **Thursday**, the **Year 4** boys had their quarter final cup match against Greenmount. This was the team's first away game so they were buzzing. The team looked strong from their previous game so they were confident going into the match. From the first whistle, the boys were quick to shut Greenmount down and create chances for themselves. After many close chances, the goals finally start to come as the boys managed to score five goals before half time. The team had a quick rest and then prepared for the second half. The whistle blew and unfortunately the boys didn't pick up where they left off, with Greenmount having much more of the possession and putting the team on the back foot. After conceding three goals, the boys finally kicked into gear going on to score two more goals in the closing stages. The game finished 7-3 to Queensgate. This was a great result from the boys as they now progress to the semi finals of the cup.

School Transport Policy Consultation

The Isle of Wight Council is seeking residents and stakeholders view on proposed changes to the School Transport Policy (previously called the 'Home to School Transport Policy). The School Transport Policy sets out the legal responsibilities that the Council has in order to provide assistance with transport to school or another education setting for children and young people living in the local authority area.

The Council is required by law to consult on any changes to its School Transport Policy. In addition, the council is consulting in relation to post 16 travel arrangements. Although there is no automatic entitlement to local authority funded school or college transport once a student is over the age of 16, Isle of Wight Council makes discretionary funding available in certain circumstances.

If approved, changes to the policy will be applied to new applications from September 2024.

The consultation is open now and will close at 11.59pm on Wednesday 13th March 2024.
