#### **Out and About**

The Out and About team from **2KA** visited the Dragon Tree in Brighstone on Tuesday morning. After discussing what animals need to survive and talking about habitats, the children were challenged to design their own animal using clay and natural found objects. The children spoke about the different features of their animal; what type of habitat it would live in, where it would sleep and what it would eat. They all enjoyed having a little go on the tyre swing over the stream too!

"We went to the Dragon Tree. We were finding out about what animals need; food, water, oxygen and shelter! We made our own creatures out of clay- mine was a bit like a monkey. I used sticks for its arms and a rock for its head. We had to think about what habitat it would live in." Charlie F 1CE











On Tuesday afternoon the **3AH** Out and About group walked up to the Longstone at Mottistone. The children have begun learning about the Stone Age in class and were excited to find out more about the special Neolithic standing stones on Mottistone Downs. The children learnt more about life during the Stone Age, how people would have lived, how people hunted, the introduction of settlements and farming as well as the different time periods; Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic.

"The Longstone is two really big stones, taller than 10ft, from the Stone Age. People used to be buried there. When people died, animals would feast on their flesh and then their bones were buried in a big

mound." Riley 3AH







The children in **Year 4** have been learning about land use, farming and where our food comes from as part of their Geography work. Last term in Science they focused on the digestive system as well as finding out about teeth. On Wednesday morning the **4BM** Out and About group visited Briddlesford Farm to learn more about life on the farm, the milking process and compared animals digestion and teeth to that of humans or other animals. The children discovered that cows are ruminants and have 4 parts to their stomach. The group were super and asked some brilliant questions.

"We went to Briddlesford farm, it's a dairy farm. They make milk, cheese, butter and meat. We met the calves and they liked sucking on everything. They didn't bite us because they only have teeth at the bottom and at the back." Alfie 4BM









Due to heavy winds and traffic delays the **1SM** Out and About team visited Quarr Abbey (instead of Borthwood Copse). The children recapped their five senses as they explored the Abbey grounds and woodland. The children also looked out for signs of Autumn and enjoyed throwing sycamore seeds up into the air, hunting for the biggest leaf and splashing in puddles. The children had fun feeding the pigs too.

"We went to Quarr abbey and bought some pig food for the pigs. Then we fed the pigs, we walked past the church and went to the woods. It's Autumn and the leaves have started to fall down. They've turned brown, red and yellow. We talked about our five senses." Jacob 1SM


