Please remember to keep socially distanced at pick up and drop off and around the school gates and at the road crossing too.

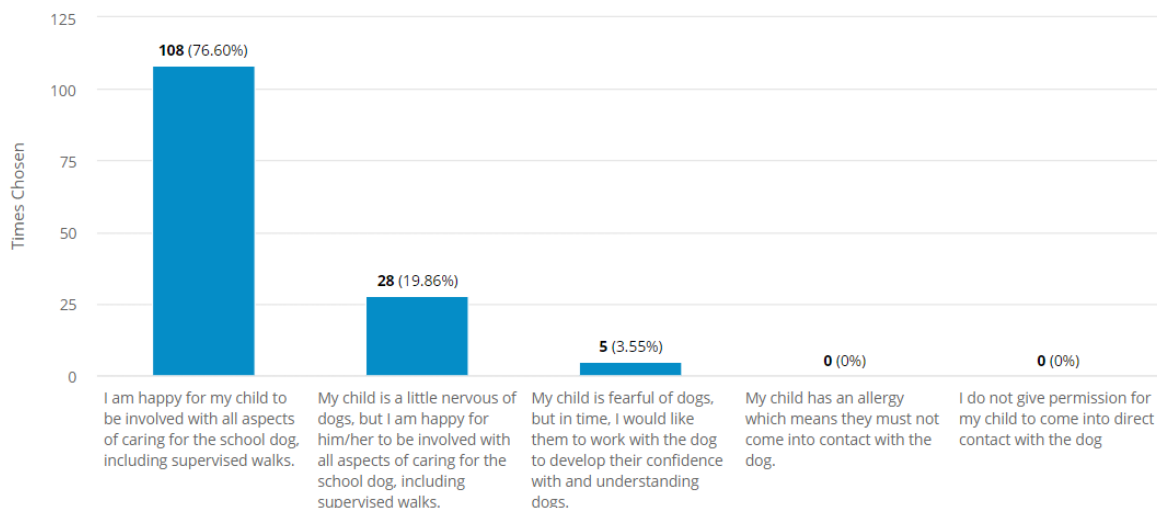
Benji Blog

There is rising excitement in school and this week I received my first picture of Benji with some great writing from Malaika.

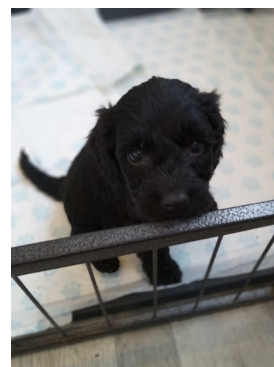

Here is our code for the children working with Benji. We will go through this in school, but please go through with your children at home too.

Code of Conduct for working with Benji

- ◆ We only touch Benji with permission from an adult
- ◆ We are kind to Benji
- ◆ We always use quiet voices near Benji
- ◆ We walk or sit near Benji
- ◆ We keep our heads higher than Benji's head
- ◆ We make sure Benji has plenty of room to move around
- ◆ We give Benji clear, one word instructions e.g. 'sit', 'down', 'no'
- ◆ We wash our hands before and after touching Benji



In the early days, when Benji is a young puppy, he will spend most of his time in the office learning good manners! We will introduce staff and children slowly to him. There is a new section of the website click on school then Benji the school dog. Here you will find the code, the risk assessment and a Q and A.
