Out & About

On Tuesday morning, our final **Reception** Out and About team went to Ryde to learn more about different types of transport. The children were all incredibly excited to travel on the electric train from Ryde Esplanade! They listened carefully to our safety instructions and were very sensible waiting on the platforms, boarding and disembarking the trains and changing platforms. They travelled to Brading, where they enjoyed listening to non-fiction transport books and fiction books about trains, whilst having a snack and waiting for their return train. It was wonderful to see how much the children enjoyed their Out and About adventure. Our Reception classes have been very fortunate to be able to travel on the train this half term for free, thanks to South Western Railway.







On Tuesday afternoon our **Year 5** Out and About group went to Bonchurch to follow the Solar System trail along the revetment towards Ventnor. The children worked well as a team, taking it in turns to read and learn more about each planet. The walk provides information panels about each planet and represents the distance from the sun with a scale of 1 inch: 100,000 miles which helped the children to understand the distance between each planet. We explored the comparable size of the planets using sports balls as well as discussing how long it takes for each planet to orbit the sun, the composition of the planets and their unique features.







The children in **Year 4** have been studying the book *The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind* by William Kamkwamba. To tie in with their text, the Out and About group visited Bembridge Windmill. The children discussed what windmills do and the history behind Bembridge Windmill. They used pens to have a go at line drawings of the mill before using maps to navigate a walk to Whitecliff Bay. The children all demonstrated great determination and camaraderie as they hiked through the woodland, down the steep path down to the bay then back to the minibus. Well done Year 4!







Out & About con't

The **Year 6** Out and About team from **6TM** went Geocaching around Merstone old railway station and the surrounding farmland. The children used the Geocaching app on their mobile phones to hunt for different caches, using GPS and solving hints. They were able to locate five caches in the vicinity, recording in each logbook. Each cache varied in size with one being 'micro' (about a 3cm tube), another stored in an old film canister and a few in small tubs with swappable items inside. The group worked well together and all children were keen to help locate the caches and find as many as they could within the time.







The Out and About after school club had fun in Firestone Copse on Wednesday evening. The children had a walk in the woods, exploring different paths and stopping for a snack.
