Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

The Summer Reading Challenge is here! A fantastic, fun and <u>free</u> way to support your child's learning and avoid the 'summer skills dip'. This year the theme is **Gadgeteers** and the Reading Agency is working with Science Museums Group, aiming to inspire children's imagination, creativity and invention. It's <u>free</u> to join, and every child who joins gets a special Gadgeteers poster. As they read books, they receive stickers and rewards. When they've read six books, they get a medal and certificate. Any child aged three and over can take part in the challenge. Younger brothers and sisters can join in, too, with a special Gadgeteers mini-challenge for babies and toddlers. Schools might ask children to show their medals or certificates after the holiday.

Although our library is currently closed for the exciting development of a new library and community hub, The East Side Curve, we have been running an order, collect and return system from the Town Hall for adults and a browse and borrow library for children. QUEENSGATE SPORT ROUNDUP

The mixed Year 3/4 Cricket team took part in the IOW finals at Queensgate this week. The team had earned their place having beaten Wootton and Haylands in earlier rounds.

They played Broadlea in the first game and won quite easily by taking lots of wickets - this meant that when they started batting with their 200 allotted runs, they were already 14 runs ahead. Next to face the team were Dover Park. It was a similar game and outcome to the first game with great bowling and fielding restricting Dover Park to a low total. Some excellent batting ensured that victory was secured. This meant that the team was through to the final, where we came up against Holy Cross. Queensgate were put into bat first, and scored a respectable amount, Holy Cross chased this total hard, and only some great bowling restricted them. This was a much closer game than the previous two and the margin of victory was only 15 runs. Massive congratulations on this victory as it's the first time that Queensgate have won this tournament (very fitting for Mr Giles' retirement!) He certainly looks happy about it in this picture!



Year 6 Sea Safety

We were invited to Ryde Beach to work with the life guards. The lifeguards talked to us on arrival. We then got into wetsuits. The first activity was to hold up some letters which spelt **SAFE** - this was an acronym for **S**pot the danger, **A**dvise - read the signs, swim where there are lifeguards, **F**riends and **F**amily - swim with other people, **E**mergency - call for help. We then went down to the beach with floats. We practised lying down in a starfish shape - this would help acclimatise the body in the water. Then we made a Curled up shape with our bodies, this was for warmth. Finally, we had to get in a group huddle to keep warm; people facing the sea had to shout wave when they saw one, the people facing the beach had to look for people to get their attention, then organise the huddle to shout altogether. We then went into the water to practise the drills. It was a really fun day and learnt lots of life saving skills. By Jaiden D 6LR






