Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

The **Summer Reading Challenge** is here! A fantastic, fun and **free** way to support your child's learning and avoid the 'summer skills dip'. This year the theme is **Gadgeteers** and the Reading Agency is working with Science Museums Group, aiming to inspire children's imagination, creativity and invention. It's **free** to join, and every child who joins gets a special Gadgeteers poster. As they read books, they receive stickers and rewards. When they've read six books, they get a medal and certificate. Any child aged three and over can take part in the challenge. Younger brothers and sisters can join in, too, with a special Gadgeteers mini-challenge for babies and toddlers. Schools might ask children to show their medals or certificates after the holiday.

Although our library is currently closed for the exciting development of a new library and community hub, **The East Side Curve**, we have been running an order, collect and return system from the Town Hall for adults and a browse and borrow library for children. This will continue but we hope to be moving into our new building during the school summer holiday. Please see our current Town Hall opening times.

Do look out for exciting news about our **East Side Curve**, including the Community Library, opening to the public. When the Community Library is moved into the new East Side Curve, we aim to offer activities and events, including a **Summer Reading Challenge story and chat session each Wednesday between 10.00am and 11.00am with volunteer Angie Mathews**. This will be aimed at 4-8 year olds but all children are welcome. You won't need to stay for the whole session, with the starting book aimed at the younger children and the end chats, about local inventions, aimed at the older ones. Reading Challenge Rewards will be available whenever you return books.

As always, joining the library is free and you can use all County Council and Community Libraries on your ticket. Currently we are **not charging** late return fines or for replacement library cards. We have a lot of library cards awaiting collection and some outstanding books from last summer. Please return them ASAP, while there are no charges. Do pop in to see us!

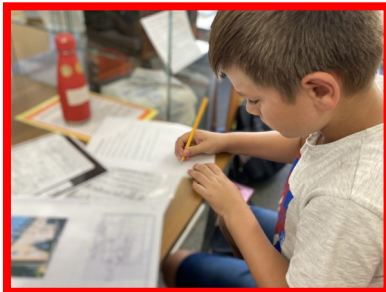

Out & About

On Wednesday morning the **5RA** Out and About team visited the Planetarium at Fort Victoria. The children were given an informative talk by astronomer, Paul England. They learnt about the Earth's tilt and why we have months and seasons, as well as discussing the phases of the moon and the link to tides. The children asked some fantastic questions and were keen to show off their knowledge on Space. They then watched some shows in the Planetarium dome about Tim Peake's mission on the International Space Station and learnt more about each planet within our Solar System.



This term Year 4 have been learning about Queen Victoria's influence on the Island. The **4AH** Out and About group met Mrs Burdett from the East Cowes Heritage Centre on Wednesday afternoon to learn more about East Cowes during Victoria's reign. Mrs Burdett walked with the group down to the Heritage Centre (on Clarence Road) explaining the changes



to the area; how it would have looked in Victorian times, the buildings, industries and jobs that people would have had. The children were really interested in finding out about details in the censuses especially regarding the jobs

children had and details of families.

The East Cowes Heritage Centre is open Monday - Saturday, 10am-1pm.

It's well worth a visit during the Summer holiday or one weekend. The Heritage Centre is a great



place to learn more about the history of East Cowes or maybe look through census details to research more about who lived in your house in the past.

QUEENSGATE SPORT ROUNDUP

The mixed Year 3/4 Cricket team took part in the IOW finals at Queensgate this week. The team had earned their place having beaten Wootton and Haylands in earlier rounds.

One school was unable to attend the finals so Queensgate had to play Dover Park twice; the team beat Dover Park both times - by 29 runs and 36 runs.

In the semi-final, the team played Nettlestone; Nettlestone batted first and scored 234-1 – some super bowling and fielding helped keep this low. In reply, Queensgate hit out from the start and ended on 257-1 – everyone contributing well.

The final was against Gurnard; Gurnard batted first and scored 237-1 – again some good bowling and fielding was displayed by the Queensgate team. In reply, the team scored quickly but had a wobble near the end. However, good batting ensured a final score of 246-2 and a 9 run win.

This was the first time Queensgate has won this competition so very well done to the team.

Beach Cricket Success

The Under 11 Cricket Team entered the Beach Cricket tournament at Appley Sands. They played Broadlea in the first game and won quite easily by taking lots of wickets - this meant that when they started batting with their 200 allotted runs, they were already 14 runs ahead. Some great batting added to this score and only a couple of wicket losses meant that Queensgate were the winners.

Next to face the team were Dover Park. It was a similar game and outcome to the first game with great bowling and fielding restricting Dover Park to a low total. Some excellent batting ensured that victory was secured. This meant that the team was through to the final, where we came up against Holy Cross. Queensgate were put into bat first, and scored a respectable amount, Holy Cross chased this total hard, and only some great bowling restricted them. This was a much closer game than the previous two and the margin of victory was only 15 runs. Massive congratulations on this victory as it's the first time that Queensgate have won this tournament (very fitting for Mr Giles' retirement!) He certainly looks happy about it in this picture!



Year 6 Sea Safety

We were invited to Ryde Beach to work with the life guards. The lifeguards talked to us on arrival. We then got into wetsuits. The first activity was to hold up some letters which spelt **SAFE** - this was an acronym for **S**pot the danger, **A**dvice - read the signs, swim where there are lifeguards, **F**riends and **F**amily - swim with other people, **E**mergency - call for help. We then went down to the beach with floats. We practised lying down in a starfish shape - this would help acclimatise the body in the water. Then we made a Curled up shape with our bodies, this was for warmth. Finally, we had to get in a group huddle to keep warm; people facing the sea had to shout wave when they saw one, the people facing the beach had to look for people to get their attention, then organise the huddle to shout altogether. We then went into the water to practise the drills. It was a really fun day and learnt lots of life saving skills. By Jaiden D 6LR

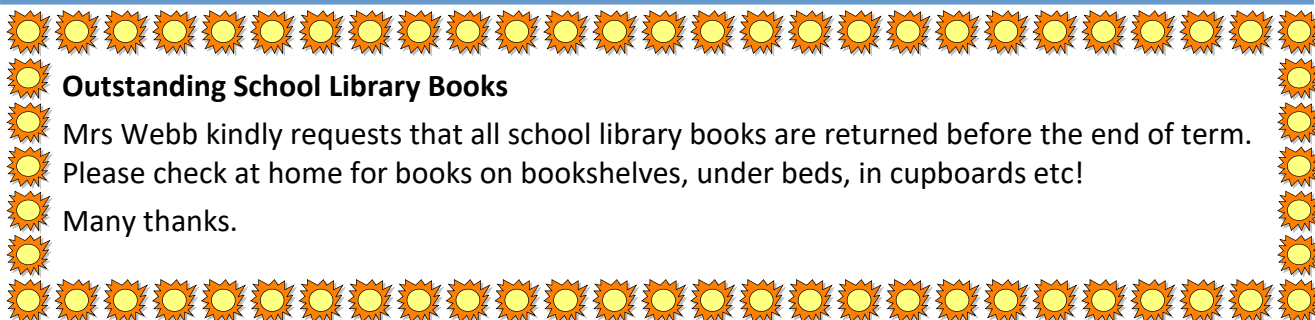

New food voucher scheme

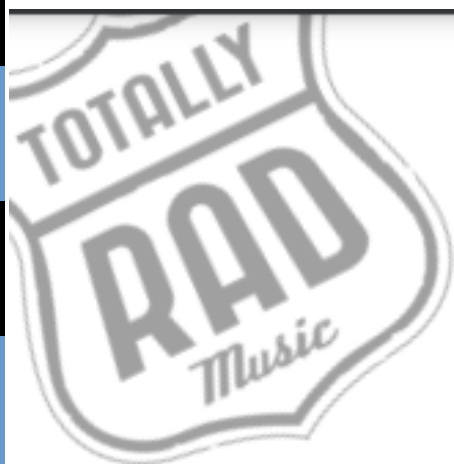
