# **Out & About**

Next term our **Year 2** children will begin their topic about the history of flight. This week the **2KG** Out and About group visited Bembridge Airport to learn about how the airport is run, features of planes and how they vary and the different parts of a plane. The children were given a special opportunity to go inside one of the hangars to see the planes. They even got to take it in turns to sit in the pilot's seat, exploring the controls and finding out what they do.

"We went to Bembridge Airport and learnt all about planes. We saw 5 aeroplanes in the hangar, and a golf cart and a big tractor that cuts the grass runway. The tail of the plane has a rudder that make the plane move left or right, that is called yaw, the flaps on wings are called ailerons, they make the plane roll from side to side and the elevator at the back makes the plane move up and down. The air splits as it goes over and under the wing. The air going over the top of the wing has to go faster which makes the plane fly." Teddy 2KG







Our **Year 3** children have been learning all about the Stone Age this half term. On Tuesday afternoon, our **3AH** group visited the Shipwreck Centre and Maritime Museum. The children took part in a workshop where they learnt more about a Stone Age village that was discovered by divers near Bouldnor, Yarmouth. They explored how archaeologists are able to date objects that they find using stratigraphy and core samples.

"On Out and About we went to the museum at the Shipwreck Centre and we were learning all about maritime archaeology. We went into two groups. One group went to do a treasure hunt around the museum and the other group went to learn about the layers in soil called stratas. We learnt a story about Larry the lobster who discovered lots of Stone Age tools when he was building his house, under the sea, near Yarmouth. The Out and About trip was amazing, I learnt lots." ## **Out and About continued**

On Wednesday, our final **Year 4** Out and About group visited Nettlecombe Farm. The children all enjoyed hand feeding the animals as they toured the farm, learning lots about each animal's teeth, diet, digestive system and feet (this tied into some of their recent Science work). Earlier this term in Geography, the children found out about the farming industry on the Island. They discussed how Nettlecombe Farm is not a commercial farm but the animals are kept as pets alongside nine holiday cottages, a fishing lake and yoga studio that all generate an income for the farm.

"We went to a farm and fed animals. We learnt that the reindeer's antlers fall off after Christmas and they grow new ones back every year. The goats just lick the food off your hand because they only have bottom teeth, just like sheep and cows. My favourite bit was feeding the chickens, letting them peck the food from my hands." "My favourite part of visiting the farm was feeding the goats. They don't have top teeth. The alpacas were spitting at each and were having staring contest! The farm makes money by renting out cottages for people to stay for holidays, there's a fishing lake and they run yoga classes. They don't eat the animals on the farm, they are just pets." The children in **Year 1** have been enjoying their topic about *toys* this half term. This week's Out and About team from **1SM** went on a mission to find Mog, a little lost cat (toy). The children found clues and used maps to hunt for the cat. The trail led them to the park, then south, along towards St. Mildred's church. They used compasses to navigate which direction to go in and successfully read the clues (practising their Phase 5 phonics). The group successfully found poor Mog, stuck up a tree in the church grounds!


- Include your regular routine as much as possible if this helps you.


The OT Toolbox has created a Christmas mindfulness activity that can help to focus on one thought at a time as well as lessen anxious thoughts.

# Children's COVID-19 Vaccination Appointments – Children's Outpatient Department, North Hospital

We are offering the following Children's COVID Vaccination Clinics for Ages 5-11, Ages 12-15 and Ages 16-17 in the Children's Outpatients Department, North Hospital, St Mary's (NOT the Hospital Vaccine Hub). Accessible parking is available in the North Car Park.

Appointments must be booked in advance, we are unable to offer walk-ins.

After the 15 December the NBS booking system will not be available until the Spring and so **please** book appointments by calling 0300 561 0018

Please note that Children are eligible if:

- they have an immunosuppressed disorder
- or have close family contact with someone who has an immunosuppressed disorder or have not had any COVID vaccination in the past.

All vaccines offered will be the Pfizer XBB.1.5 vaccines.
