## **Road Safety Week**

We all drive too fast sometimes...

- "I didn't notice I was going so fast!"
- "Everyone else is doing it so why can't I?"
- "A few miles an hour won't make much difference will it?"

But every time we driver faster than the speed limit, or too fast for the road conditions, we increase the risk of a crash – and we increase the chance that someone we love will be killed or hurt on a road.

Whoever you are, however you travel, We need to talk about SPEED.

Don't forget that our Junior Travel Ambassadors launched a competition in assembly last Friday. Key Stage 1 children had the task of designing a fluorescent, bright and vibrant back pack. ## Measles on the Increase

For children up to five, please check your child's vaccination status as the measles vaccine rates have fallen to a 10 year low. Figures recently published show that only 84.5% percent of children have received the second shot of the MMR vaccine in 2022/2023 - the figure should be around 95%. As you may have seen on the news there was a global outbreak of measles and many confirmed cases, particularly in countries where vaccines are low.

## Out & About

After Christmas our **Year 2** children will be learning about the history of flight. In readiness, the **2KA** Out and About group had a very special trip to Bembridge Airport to learn about aeroplanes and how an airport is run. The children visited the air traffic control room where they found out about the importance of radio communication and how weather impacts on flight. They then went inside one of the hangars to see the aircraft and even had the opportunity to sit in one of the planes. The children explored how you would fly a plane by using the joystick, moving the ailerons on the wings, the elevator on the tail and the rudder. "We went to the airport. We went in a plane and could control the wings and the elevator at the back. The planes lived in a big hangar. My favourite bit was sitting on a plane!" Riley 2KA







On Tuesday afternoon the **3PT** Out and About team visited the Shipwreck Centre and Maritime Museum in Arreton. The children have been learning about the Stone Age recently. They furthered their knowledge during a workshop at the museum, finding out how marine archaeologists discovered a Stone Age village at Bouldnor cliffs, near Yarmouth. The children learnt about stratigraphy and how items found below the ground are dated by which strata they are found within.

"We went to the Shipwreck Centre. We learnt about things that have been found by marine archaeologists near Bouldnor Cliff. My favourite part was hunting for the clues in the museum." Corey 3PT

"We learnt about stratas and how they tell us where things were found and so how old things are. We got to do an experiment using a plastic straw to get through the stratas (using plasticine) and took samples. We got to see flint and Stone Age tools that had been found by divers." Lille-May 3PT







The **4MC** Out and About group visited Briddlesford Farm on Wednesday morning. The children had a tour of the farm, finding out how the farm is run and the milking process. The children met different people that work at the farm who talked about their job roles and the skills needed for their jobs. As part of their Science work, the children learnt about the digestive system of cows as well as their teeth. At the end of their visit, the children enjoyed a cup of creamy Briddlesford milk!

"We went to Briddlesford Farm. It's a dairy farm, they make milk and cheese. They have about 120 cows at the moment. We got to feed and stroke the cows. The calves kept trying to lick my coat. My favourite part was when we got to see the farm cats- there were 10 altogether! They help on the farm to stop the mice from eating the cows food. We learnt that cows have 4 stomachs and the cows don't bite you because they only have teeth on the bottom and top ones just at the back. We had a very fun time, we all really enjoyed it!" The children in **Year 1** have been learning about Toys. This week our **1CE** Out and About team visited Puckpool Park to complete a mission, to help find a lost toy. The children were all amazing at using their phonic knowledge to read clues that led them around the Old Battery and play park. They all worked together and were delighted to find the teddy. Fantastic teamwork!

"We went to Puckpool Park to try and find a lost teddy, Mrs Johnson's little boy's teddy. We had clues and a map to find the teddy bear. We found him near the haunted house and we got chocolate coins for finding him! We then played in the park, I liked the climbing." Imogen 1CE
