### Out & About

Next half term Our **Reception** classes will be exploring the topic, *The Seaside*. On Tuesday morning the **RAB** Out and About group visited St Helens Beach. The children enjoyed baking cakes in the 'sand kitchen', collecting shells, paddling in the sea, building sandcastles and listening to seaside stories. It was wonderful to see the children so immersed in their play.



The **6LR** Out and About team went orienteering around Firestone Copse on Tuesday afternoon. They practised using a compass to navigate to the different markers. The children demonstrated brilliant map reading and team skills, finding a total of 13 orienteering markers!







On Wednesday morning the **5RA** Out and About group followed the Solar System Trail from Bonchurch to Ventnor. The children learnt about each of the different planets, their distance from the sun and from each other. They compared the relative size of each of the planets using sports balls and modelled how the planets orbit the sun.



Year 4 will be learning about the increase in tourism on the Island during the Victorian era, after half term. The **4MC** Out and About children walked up to Tennyson Monument on Wednesday afternoon. The children showed great determination and resilience as they walked up the Downs (into a head wind!). They learnt a bit about Alfred Lord Tennyson and his life on the Island whilst having a biscuit at the top!



The **Out and About club** had fun walking around the castle wall and up to the Keep at Carisbrooke Castle on Wednesday after school. The children liked looking around Beatrice's garden and trying on the different helmets knights would have worn throughout the castle's history.

former pupil Dan Cox, who led all the sessions, brilliantly. It was good to see all the pupils involved in some fielding skills and a batting game. Thanks Dan.



The Isle of Wight Council is offering one-off emergency vouchers to families in need of emergency support with food for the May half term holiday 2022.

The vouchers will be issued directly to eligible families who must apply to the council themselves.

Applications are open until 4pm on Wednesday 1 June.

The scheme is available to:

- Families eligible for benefits related to school meals,
- Children with a social worker,
- Children open to early help,
- 2 4 year-olds eligible for Early Years Pupil Premium

Vouchers will be issued at the value of £15 per child for the week and only for the May half term period. Eligible people will receive a voucher that can be redeemed at local supermarkets.




