Hope Church have given the children a small gift called treat not trick. These will be coming home next Friday.

Tips for Hearing your child read

Please remember to hear your child read every day if possible. A little and often works best.

1. Choose a quiet time

Set aside a quiet time with no distractions. Ten minutes is long enough.

2. Make reading enjoyable

Make reading an enjoyable experience. Sit with your child. Little and often works best and keeps your child motivated. If your child is reluctant, try using 'now and next' – 'now' we will read, 'next' you can play with your Lego.

3. Maintain the flow

If your child mispronounces a word do not interrupt immediately. Instead allow opportunity for self-correction. It is better to tell a child some unknown words to maintain the flow rather than insisting on trying to build them all up from the sounds of the letters. If your child does try to 'sound out' words, encourage the use of letter sounds rather than 'alphabet names'.

4. Be positive

If your child says something nearly right to start with that is fine. Don't say 'No. That's wrong,' but 'Let's read it together' and point to the words as you say them. Boost your child's confidence with constant praise for even the smallest achievement.

5. Regular practice


Try to read with your child every day if possible.

6. Communicate

Your child has a reading diary, please sign this when your child has read. Your child will then know that you are interested in their progress and that you value reading.

7. Talk about the books

There is more to being a good reader than just being able to read the words accurately. Just as important is being able to understand what has been read. Always talk to your child about the book; about the pictures, the characters, how they think the story will end, their favourite part. You will then be able to see how well they have understood and you will help them to develop good comprehension skills.





Queensgate Out & About

Our Year 2 children have been sharing stories about dragons recently. On Tuesday morning, our Year 2 children visited the Dragon Tree in Brighstone and heard the tale of how local people slayed the dragon and it turned into a tree! The children then learnt about what living things need to survive. They designed their own mythical creatures using clay, explaining what they would need to survive; what they would eat, where they would sleep, their predators and what habitat they would live in.

"We went to the Dragon Tree and learnt about what animals need to survive. They need food, water, oxygen and shelter. We made our own clay creatures. We had a paddle in the stream and played pooh-sticks. It was really fun." Sadie 2KA







As part of our **Year 5** Geography curriculum, the children have been learning how to use a compass and find six figure grid references on an OS map. On Tuesday afternoon, the children used maps and compasses to follow a loop trail, visiting Alverstone Nature Reserve. They enjoyed looking out for wildlife at the bird hide and walking along the boardwalk.







Queensgate Out & About Continued

In **Year 1**, the children have been learning about the five senses. This week, the Out and About group visited Borthwood Copse to explore their senses and look out for signs of Autumn. The children worked in pairs to gather leaves and natural objects to create a collage of a face. They described how the items felt and why they had chosen them. The children enjoyed listening to the story The Leaf Thief by Alice Hemming it's about a squirrel that discovers what happens in the Autumn. After the story, the children spotted a real red squirrel climbing a tree nearby!

"We went to the woods and talked about the five senses; touch, taste, smell, see and hear. Then we made a face using leaves and acorns and had a story about a squirrel who lost his leaves. In the Autumn the leaves change colour and they fall off the trees!" Theo WF 1SC

Eco Tips!

Energy prices are in the headlines again! So ...

- · Unplug appliances when not in use
- \cdot Install smart meters to power them down completely and help you to keep an eye on your expenditure
- · Insulate your hot water heater, pipes and ducts
- \cdot Use draft excluders to keep the heat in
- · It takes more energy to boil a full kettle; only boil what you need
- \cdot Bleed radiators as trapped air leaves cold spots at the top
- · Avoid putting furniture in front of radiators and blocking heat
- · Adjust your thermostat; it can make a big difference and save your energy costs
- · Swap halogen, fluorescent or incandescent light bulbs for LED lights they are the most energy efficient option




Whole School Attendance since September is 95.6%






