School Council Meeting

The school council met on Thursday 5th June and were tasked, among other things, to discuss our rewards system. The majority of the feedback that our reps gave from the rest of the children is that they are bored with the physical rewards and much prefer whole class rewards like time in the Patch, sensory area, extra break and receiving good news cards. Interestingly, they felt that it was too easy to get rewards and felt that rewards should only be given when reaching 50, 100 and 150 before then still working towards 200 and a book. Generally they liked Dojos. The staff and SLT have also had their say and we will combine the ideas to change the system for the new academic year.

Busy week for Year 1 and Year 4

Next week, Year 1 will be sitting the Phonics Screen, they will do this on an individual basis with the class teachers and it is an opportunity to show everyone how well they are doing with the sounds and early reading. This is a National screen and results will be shared at the end of year with parents of those children in Year 1 through their school reports, and as a total percentage to the rest of the community.

Year 4 will be sitting the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) next week. This is a National check and each child will individually, on a laptop, answer multiplication and division questions in a timed scenario.

Eco Day

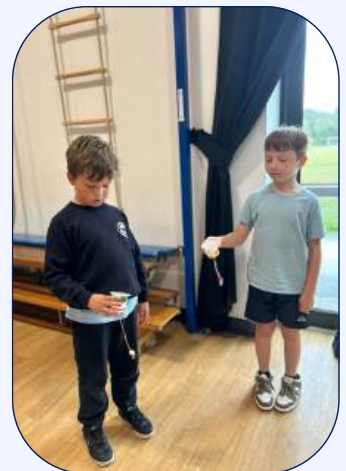
On Thursday, as part of our Eco Schools project, we were visited by Ella from Island Waste.

Queensgate Out & About

The rain didn't stop our Reception Out and About children having fun at the beach on Tuesday morning! The children had a great time collecting water in the pools, hunting for crabs under rocks and creating some tasty looking cakes and ice-creams in their sand café. Some of the children made their own "aquariums", making habitats in containers for the tiny shrimp, fish and crabs they had found! The children were all amazingly confident and keen to hold the little crabs. Before the group headed back to school, they were excited to see all the goslings near the Boating Lake.



On Tuesday afternoon our soggy, Year 3 Out and About group walked through Newport, following the River Medina, to tie in with their recent Geography topic on Rivers. The children made comparisons between the Western Yar (from their last Out and About session) and the Medina; noting the urban location, industries along the river, pollution and how the traffic moves over the river at Coppins Bridge.



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Our Year 1 children will be learning about Grace Darling and Lighthouses this half term. This week the Out and About group enjoyed a walk along the coast of Niton to see St Catherine's Lighthouse. The children sketched the octagonal structure and listened to stories about lighthouses whilst having their snack. They took great care with their drawings, showing real attention to detail.



The Year 2 Out and About team visited Firestone Copse on Wednesday afternoon. The children have been learning about deciduous and evergreen trees and used their leaf identification charts to name different trees around the woodland. The group were very enthusiastic and keen to take it in turns to lead the walk. They spotted lots of wild spotted orchids too!

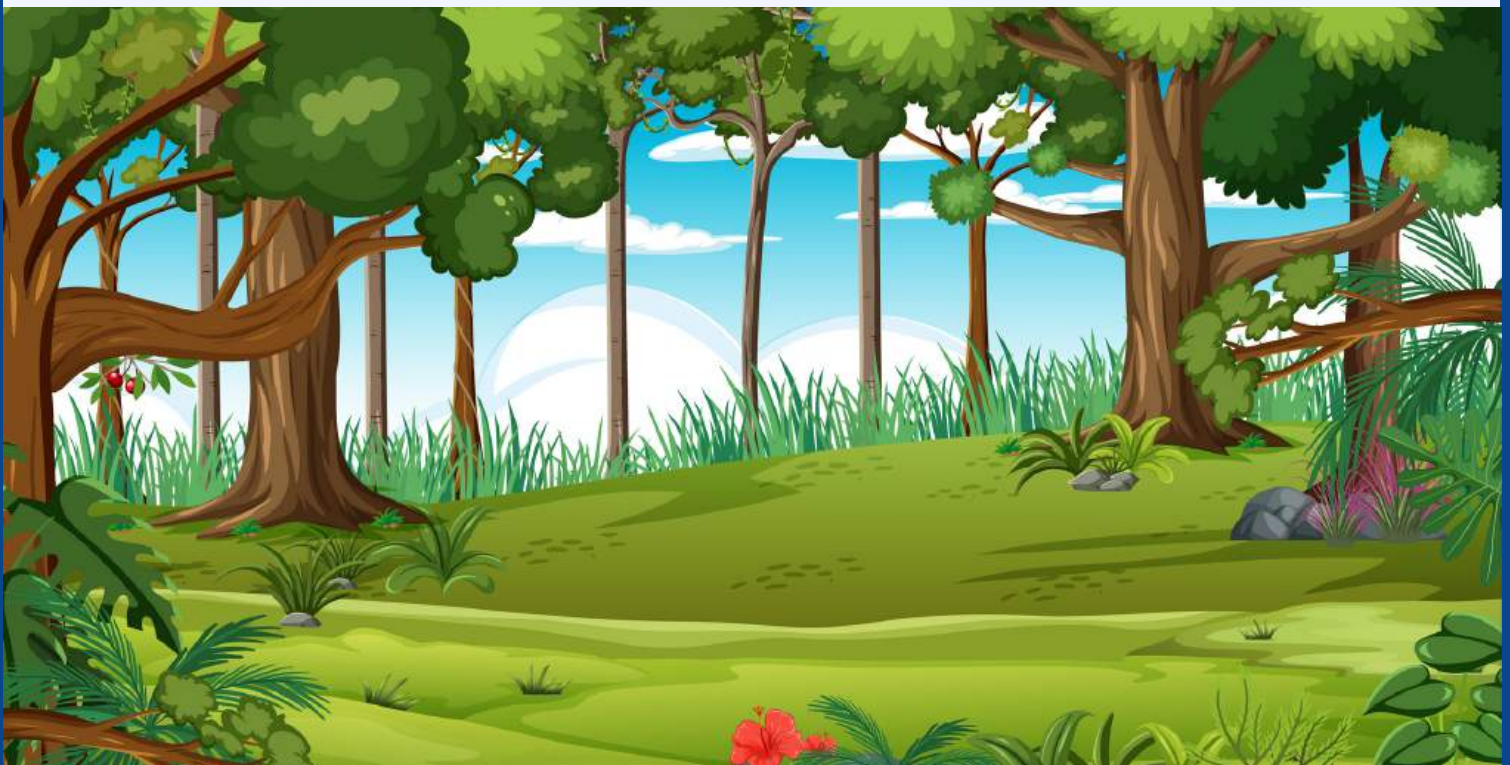

NHS 111 Online & Local Pharmacies

NHS 111 online and local pharmacies can help you get the right care

People with urgent but non-life-threatening medical needs are encouraged to use NHS 111 online to get quick advice and be directed to the most appropriate care, especially over the bank holiday weekend when services are expected to be busy.

NHS 111 online is a fast and easy-to-use alternative to the NHS 111 phone service. It can provide help for people 5 years and over by assessing symptoms, giving advice on what to do next, and connecting people to local services without having to wait on the phone.

Whether you need help with a minor injury, mental health support, advice about dental pain, or emergency medication, NHS 111 online is available 24/7. It's especially useful if you can't get a GP appointment or your surgery is closed.

Sophia from Newport recently searched 111.nhs.uk for help when she woke up with red, itchy insect bites after a family BBQ. When they started getting worse, she used NHS 111 online for advice and was directed to her local pharmacy. The pharmacist recommended a cream and gave her tips on managing the symptoms including what to do if the bites got worse.

Sophia said: "I was glad I went online first. A friend suggested I go to hospital but that didn't feel right for a few bites. The pharmacy was exactly what I needed."

Lee Haward, IW Ambulance Service Head of Clinical Coordination Centre, said: "If you've got access to the internet, NHS 111 online is a really quick and easy way to get help. It works just like calling 111, but you can do it all online, anytime, day or night. Just go to the NHS 111 website or use the NHS App, answer a few questions about how you're feeling, and it will guide you to the right care. It's really easy to use and there when you need help."

Pharmacies can help with minor illnesses - Your local pharmacy is also a great source of expert help for minor conditions. As part of the Pharmacy First scheme, many community pharmacies can now offer clinical advice and treatment for common illnesses without the need to see a GP:

Sinusitis

Sore throat

Earache

Infected insect bites

Impetigo (a bacterial skin infection)

Shingles

Uncomplicated urinary tract infections (in women)

Nature Notes in Brief

Bumble bees are not the same as Honey bees

Bumble bees are wild bees. They live in small colonies or even on their own (solitary bees) in tiny holes in the ground - often previously made and abandoned by a mouse or in a tree hole. Bumble bees only live for a year. The queen bee once mated, will hibernate for the Winter. The other bees die having done their job. The queen emerges in early Spring looking for pollen and nectar to feed her larva now in a cocoon. The larva emerge as female worker bees bringing back more pollen to the nest. The queen lays more eggs which will hatch into new queens and male bumble bees. The newly mated queens feed on nectar and pollen ready to overwinter in an underground burrow. The rest of the bumblebees in the colony die as the weather begins to turn colder.
