Out and About

On Tuesday the **1KS** Out and About group visited Osborne House. In class they have been learning about Victorian Christmas traditions so it was super to be able to see the house all set up as it would have looked when Queen Victoria and Albert spent Christmas there. The children counted the many Christmas trees as they explored the house and hunted for the missing wreaths around the gardens







3PT had fun making fires on the Patch on Tuesday afternoon! They celebrated their last Patch afternoon for the term by practising to build and light fires, using the Kelly Kettle to boil water for hot chocolates and toasting marshmallows over the fire pit. We all had such a brilliant time.







As part of their topic on *People Who Help Us*, **RAS** welcomed Mr Cox into their classroom to talk about being a firefighter! Mr Cox became a Fireman at the age of 16 and worked as a retained firefighter in East Cowes for 40 years. 


Year 4 Egyptian Museum
