Queensgate Success this Week

Dear Families,

Success!

This week Dean Prodomo, The Service Manager for Education on the Isle of Wight, visited Queensgate. He said he thoroughly enjoyed his visit, seeing the multitude of activities for the children and how keen they were to chat to him about their learning. He saw wonderful singing from Year 6, maths orienteering with Year 1, computing in Year 5 and 3, cooking for a voyage with Year 2 and much more.

Our Year 6 teachers have been moderated. This means that the children's writing books have been looked at by moderators from the Hampshire moderation team. All of our judgements were confirmed and verified, which we are delighted about. Well done to our teaching team and the Year 6 children.

Our Year 4 children have completed their multiplication check this week, Year 1 children have completed their phonic screening and Year 2 children have completed their re-takes. Well done to all of the children in these year groups.

As you know I am often encouraging good attendance. Currently Queensgate is above National Averages both for May and in our running total since September. Well done everyone. Please keep it up!

The absence rates across the week commencing 20 May 2024 were:

6.6% (93.4%) in state-funded primary schools (4.0% authorised and 2.6% unauthorised) Queensgate for that week = 94.63% (+1.23%)

The absence rates across the academic year 2023/24 to date (24th May) were:

5.4% (94.6%) in state-funded primary schools (3.9% authorised and 1.5% unauthorised) Queensgate for the year to date = 95.09% (+0.49%)

Platform One Embark On Island Wide Schools Tour

The established music college aim to perform in 20 schools in 10 days with a live performance from the 2024 Wight Noize winner.

Platform One, who have been the leading music education provider on the island since 1999, will be capitalising on the excitement created by the Isle of Wight Festival and transferring that to primary school children across a 10-date tour.

Platform One 'On The Road' will see recent Wight Noize winner 'Marnie Marie' and her band perform a selection of tracks just days after opening the mainstage at Seaclose.

Andy Booth, the Music Industry Liaison at Platform One, says encouraging young people to engage in music has many benefits.

"We have a duty to ensure that we are inspiring and educating young children through music. Research suggests that both listening to music and playing a musical instrument can help reduce stress and anxiety, as well as strengthen muscle memory and coordination."

Booth, who also has a seat on the Futures Board at UK Music reiterates the new national plan for music education. "Music should be represented in every school's leadership structure. The vision is to enable all children and young people to play an instrument, learn to sing and create music together. They should all have the opportunity to pursue interests and talents"

In addition to the live performance, Platform One will also be discussing the selection of instruments being used with members of the band showcasing their respective specialism.

"We would have loved to have been able to visit every single school on the island, but we are restricted by the end of the school term. The response has been fantastic and we have been inundated with requests to visit"

The schools tour will begin on Wednesday 26th June and run until Wednesday 10th July. The trip will be documented and can be followed on Platform One social media @platformoneiow.

Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to invite you to come along to a free, informal maths group that is held at Queensgate Primary School **every Friday morning at 9:15am** for one hour. This opportunity is possible due to funding from the **Multiply Project**, which aims to support adults across the UK with improving their maths skills. Here on the Isle of Wight, the team at Adult Community Learning provides a wide range of courses and workshops in many different venues, including schools. I have been running the group at Queensgate for some time now, and am always keen to encourage new learners to take advantage of the support available.

The focus of the schools' project is to enable parents and carers to develop their own confidence and maths skills, so that they can in turn support their children more effectively with maths at home. Research has shown that if adults have good maths skills, their children are much more likely to achieve better at school, and to have a positive attitude towards the subject. Having good basic maths skills is crucial in everyday life, from personal budgeting to reading timetables, measurement and following recipes.

So, what can you expect from the maths sessions at Queensgate? First and foremost, it's a relaxed, friendly environment, where you will feel fully supported by me and the other members of the group. All the learning is personalised to suit your needs. You can work at your own pace and at your own level, on topics that are most relevant for you. There is even an opportunity to work towards a formal qualification if you would like to, which could help you to access job opportunities in the future.

I have worked with lots of parents at Queensgate over the past year or so. They have all said how much they have enjoyed the course, how it has helped them to become so much more confident with their maths skills, and how it has made them realise that maths is nowhere near as scary as they had previously thought!

I do hope that you'll be able to come along on a Friday morning, and will be delighted to welcome you. 

Spare Seat Application Window – Academic Year 2024/2025

This notice applies to those parents of current year 6 students who are moving up to secondary school next year and wish to apply for a place on a Council-contracted school bus service.

Dear Parent/Guardian

The dates for the spare seat application window for academic year 2024 have been finalised. Should you wish to apply for a spare seat for your child to use the school bus service you will need to apply between **9am on Monday 1st July 2024 and 4pm on Friday 12th July 2024.** Please note that the online form will only be live between the above times and that applications received outside of this window will not be accepted.

Further information on the spare seat process can be found online, here: <u>Spare seat scheme (iow.gov.uk)</u> If you scroll to the bottom of the above webpage, you will see the bus services for which you can apply. This **information will be live from 9am on Monday 17th June 2024.** Should the service you require not be listed you will not be able to apply for that service at this time.

Do bear in mind that making an application for a spare seat does not guarantee a seat on the school bus.

Ticket costs and payment

The cost of a ticket will increase from academic year 2024. This was agreed following a Cabinet decision made on 9th May 2024 following the recent <u>School Transport Policy Consultation</u>. Spare seat prices will then rise each academic year in line with CPI (Consumer Price Index) rate at March in the year that you are applying for.

Privilege seat ticket prices are set costs as follows.

- Up to a full term £190.00
- Up to half a term £95.00
- Up to a full-term AM or PM only £95.00
- Up to half a term AM or PM only £47.50

Important Points to Note

 There will only be 1 application window before the start of the academic year so please ensure you apply during this window for your child to be considered for a seat.

Information on bus services that can be offered will be available on the website from 9am on Monday 17th June 2024.

We may not be able to provide an update on the number of seats available before the application window opens but
please be aware seats availability will be very limited.

 There is a strict payment deadline for making payment. Should you miss this deadline, the seat offered to your child will be offered to the next child on the waiting list (should one exist) and your application will be cancelled.

Once applications have been processed by the Transport Team you will be able to see the status of your application
online as well as make payment without having to contact the Council.
