Attendance and Punctuality

I always include our ongoing attendance at the end of the newsletter. You may have noticed that it is going down week on week and this week is 93.96%. This is the worst attendance figure that Queensgate has had in the last ten years. Some of this is understandable due to the times we live in with people getting Covid and people being more cautious with colds and coughs.

However, we do need to work together to improve this. It is really important that children attend school every day to make the best progress. We need to be filling the gaps that the children have in their learning, not creating more. Here is what the Department of Education (DfE) has said this week:



As the new Secretary of State for Education has made clear, young people regularly attending school is a national priority and is important for their education, wellbeing, and long-term development. This is particularly true for children who were persistently absent before the pandemic or who are at risk of becoming persistently absent. Attendance continues to be mandatory for all pupils of compulsory school age and schools should communicate clear and consistent expectations about attendance.

At Queensgate, we have taken a lenient view to both fining and taking family holidays, which had been re-arranged since lockdown. After the half term break, we will not be authorising holidays in term time and we will return to fining for unauthorised time off. I therefore, thought it was timely to remind you what to do if your child is unable to attend school.

1. Please call the school office in the morning if your child is off school clearly explaining the reason why
2. Please keep in touch with us whilst your child is off ill
3. When your child comes back to school please send in a letter or email putting in writing the reason they were off

Appropriate Viewing

Please make sure you know what your child is watching and playing. The age recommendations are there for a reason. They should not be watching films, programmes or playing games over a PG.

Out & About

On Tuesday morning the second **1CE** Out and About group went for a walk in Borthwood Copse. The children looked for signs of Autumn and talked about their senses as they listened for birds and the rustling leaves. They collected dry leaves and created wreaths to take home as well as listening to Autumn stories during snack time and working together to build a den!



Some of the children in **3PT** walked up to The Longstone at Mottistone on Tuesday afternoon. Next half term they will be learning about the Stone Age and pre-history. The children visited the 6,000 year old Neolithic stones that were once the gateway to a burial ground or long barrow.



Our **4AH** Out and About team visited Yaverland beach on Wednesday morning. The children will be learning about Ancient Egypt after half term so began their topic a little early as they had a go at creating sand sculptures of Egyptian pyramids and the mythical Sphinx. We also looked at the work of artists that create beach sculptures including Andy Goldsworthy and James Brunt.

On Wednesday afternoon the **2GC** Out and About group visited Firestone Copse. As part of their recent Science work (identifying if objects are alive, dead or never been alive and what living things need to survive) the children hunted for bugs, created leaf rubbings using fallen leaves and explored artefacts lent to us by the Isle of Wight Natural History and Archeological Society.



In Out and About after-school club, the children chose to visit Osborne House. They enjoyed going inside the house, walking around the terrace and walled gardens and having a play in the park.

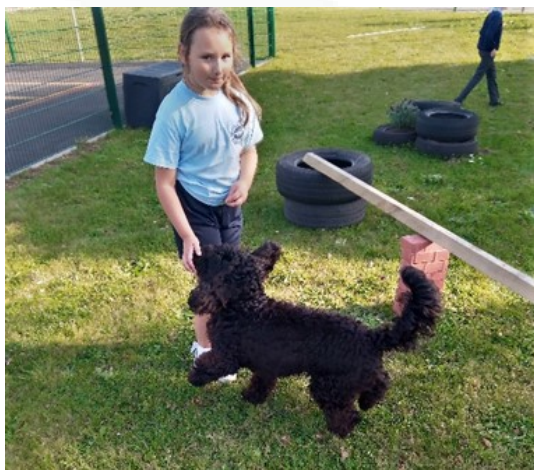

Then try this....

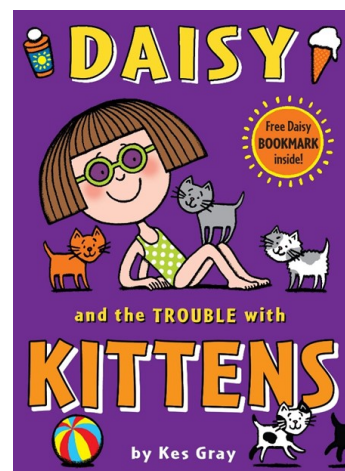
Mia in 2GC can't get enough of reading! This week she has been reading Daisy and The Trouble with Kittens, written by Kes Gray. She loves this book!
