## A Year Like No Other

Dear Parents and Carers,

### Head Teacher's Report of the year

In the **Autumn Term**, we welcomed all the children back to school after many had not attended since March. Our work focussed on filling gaps and a catch up strategy. This was mixed with on-going modification of the risk assessment and learning to run all meetings virtually, including parents' and carers' evenings. We learned how to make films and video clips. All assemblies and even open mornings were carried out virtually.

### Staffing

Having the right staff in the right place has been very challenging this year. We have had three members of staff on long-term sick – Mr Tilling, Mrs Arnell and Mrs Edgerton. Thankfully, Mrs Arnell and Mr Tilling have made a full recovery and have re-joined our team this summer term. We are hopeful Mrs Edgerton will re-join the team soon.

In addition to staff illness, we have had to contend with people shielding and self-isolating.

### Sad Events

It has been a challenging year for everyone, but Queensgate has suffered additional sadness. We have lost a dear colleague, Mrs Turner and a child from Year 6, Kyea Pinder.

### Governing Board

The Governing Board has not escaped casualties itself. We have lost our Vice-Chair, David Blades and our Chair of Governors, Leighton Atchison-Warne. Both a significant loss to the board. Both Liz Jackson and Lucy Curran have stepped up to take the helm admirably and I am very grateful to them for their hard work and dedication to our school.

Despite these significant events I would like to outline for you why I think it has been a successful year in the life of Queensgate...

### Lock Down

From January to March, we went into our third national lockdown. Queensgate provided a good education to 200 children in school. Perhaps even more remarkable than that was we had capacity to provide lessons to the 200 children working from home. We had planned carefully for the event and we were able to switch seamlessly to online learning through Zoom and Google classroom. Our emphasis became, "we are here to help." We worked tirelessly to answer phone calls and emails, mark work and give parents feedback.



We also supported well-being and mental health of our staff, children and wider families through listening, signposting to other services and email contact.

## Leadership at all Levels

Despite all that was going on, we held firm to our school improvement priorities, running two leadership projects, one in maths looking at the culture and mind-set of the school and the other in English really focussing on improving writing for individual pupils with targeted planning and support. Our subject leaders have attended virtual courses and then disseminated the work back into school. This is true of art, PSHE, history and geography. There have been good strides forward in these areas and visible raising of achievement.



## Post Covid Lockdown

Our post lockdown plans have come to fruition this summer term.

We welcomed Benji the dog to our staff team. He has proved a very popular and useful member of staff. He has supported reluctant children coming into school in the morning. He has helped with children and adults' well-being; he has encouraged good work and been a stimulus for art and poetry writing. He is certainly an asset to Queensgate.

We also wanted to enhance the school site with new playground equipment, which was planned for with the children, and they are now enjoying the benefits of it.

This term we put careful plans together thinking about what parts of the curriculum we needed to cover well to ensure that every child was ready for their next year group. We called this our sufficiency model and this gave us a structure for planning and what to report on to parents. Reports have come home today. We have employed two members of staff to support catch up ensuring gaps are filled.

We have worked closely with HTP and have employed five trainees. These young people have had a mixture of training on the job and academic and vocational courses. They have supported Queensgate children to fill gaps, whilst gaining work experience themselves. We have had positive feedback from the trainees, the children and staff of Queensgate. We wish them all well as they move into their chosen career paths.

## Building and Site

We have continued to work hard developing the site. We are working towards the end of October 2021 for the final handover from SRM to Queensgate Governors.

## NAHT and Headteacher Meetings



I have continued as President of the Isle of Wight Branch of the NAHT. This has enabled me to have a good understanding of the National picture for education. Through our officials, we have the ear of Government. I have attended all Headteacher meetings both formal and informal, which have taken a collaborative, problem solving approach.

## Succession Planning Beyond Queensgate

We have continued to work with Portsmouth Teaching Alliance and thanks to Ruth Adams and Carolyn Edmonds have ensured two more trainee teachers have met the grade needed and had very good coaching and feedback to ensure the trainee teachers go on to be successful teachers.

## Lovely Events for the Children

You only need to read the newsletter each week to know that every year group has had a trip out, Year 6 have been on residential and our Out and About and swimming curriculums have continued unabated.

Love reading?


Then try this....


Finn was most excited about the ending of the book because you find out how to uncover a big secret which makes you want to read the next book in the series.

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## Year 4 Trip to Blackgang Chine

On Friday 9<sup>th</sup> July Year 4 went to Blackgang Chine as part of their Victorian Circus project. We learnt that Blackgang first became a place of interest for visitors on the Isle of Wight in Victorian times. In 1842 a huge fin whale had been stranded off the Needles, and Alexander Dabell, the owner of the site, saw his chance to attract a crowd!

He bought the whale at auction, sold off the blubber, had the bones bleached, and transported across the island to a specially built hut, in which he displayed the skeleton to the morbid curiosity of all who visited. And though the pathways to the sea have long since washed away, the skeleton still exists in the park today as the oldest attraction, and it has set the tone for the park to become the home of the weird and the wonderful of the world, and a hive of imagination for all generations.

Today the park is still owned and run by the descendants of Alexander Dabell, and the magic of the park has only grown over the years. Blackgang Chine is now home to life-sized Pirate Ships, Fairy Villages and Castles, Dodo Valleys, restricted area 5 and of course the original Cowboy Town as well as a whole host of magical surprises around every corner.
