The **Year 2** Out and About group visited Firestone Copse for a muddy Autumn walk on Wednesday afternoon. We talked about the signs of Autumn and gathered different coloured leaves from a variety of species of trees. The children used the leaves they'd found to do leaf rubbings with wax crayons. They also used hammers to have a go at leaf bashing, creating leaf prints on fabric. 'I enjoyed doing the leaf rubbings and using the hammer to make leaf prints' Sophie 2BG

On Tuesday morning the **Year 4** Out and About group visited Sandown seafront. The children were challenged to find where they were on a map of the Island. We talked about the geography of Sandown including the sea defences and the crumbling cliffs. The children designed their own postcards of the pier which they wrote to their class teachers. Whilst sketching the pier we looked at the structure of it, made up of bollards and piles. The children enjoyed a bit of Maths on the Pier as we exchanged a £1 coin into 2p pieces and they each had a go on the 2p machines! We talked about how many 2ps we would get and how many each child should have to



make it fair. "The ten of us shared £1 so we had five 2ps each to try and win on the 2p slot machines. We had lots of fun, but sadly no one won!" Ryan F 4AH



Year 6 Out and About children had quite an adventure on Tuesday afternoon! The children worked well as a team to follow their maps, navigating their way around Parkhurst Forest to find the orienteering posts. They enjoyed using walkie-talkies to communicate with each other, sharing clues about what to look out for. The children had been walking for an hour and were nearly at the minibus when we discovered a large fallen tree on the path. Faced with the dilemma of either retracing our steps (at least an hours walk back uphill) or trying to get around the tree. The children showed great resilience as we helped each other get around the

tree (through mud, ditches and over tree roots) back on to the main path. There was certainly lots of laughter and a lot of mud!

Year 3 will be studying the Stone Age after half term. During Out and About we have been preparing

for this topic. On Wednesday morning the children visited the Longstone at Mottistone. They energetically ran to the top of the hill (in record breaking time!) to discover the 6,000 year old burial ground and where the two entrance stones still remain. The children had a go at sketching the Longstone and reading more about its history before quickly running back down to the car park.
