## Covid-19 update

I am pleased to say that at this stage we are still Covid free in that we haven't had a positive case. However, I have spoken to other Headteachers who have had positive cases in their school, and I wanted to raise your awareness that each case is assessed by Public Health England (PHE) on a case by case basis. This in turn means that schools will be required to do different things as dictated by PHE. Just wanted to make you aware that just because one school has done one thing, it doesn't necessarily mean that another school will do the same thing - it is up to PHE who decide on a school by school basis.

### **Out and About**

On Tuesday morning, the **1KS** Out and About group had a wonderful time on the Patch playing garden games including boules, swing ball, giant Jenga and Connect 4! In class they have been talking about friendships and how to be a good friend as well as exploring their topic *Toys and Games*. The children demonstrated great turn taking and sharing on the Patch, showing us what kind friends they are. Well done 1KS!







**3PT** had fun on the Patch on Tuesday afternoon before having to head back inside due to the rain. The children learnt how to make traditional Stone Age thumb pots using clay. They took great care adding intricate patterns and detail to their pots using simple tools.





The children in **Reception** were learning all about the number 3 on Wednesday, as well as practising the tricky word *the*. The RAS Out and About group made their own number 3 bags on the Patch and counted in 3 x sticks, leaves, pine cones etc. They also had fun hunting for tricky words, writing them down and collecting them in their new bags.







**2KA** have been learning about the history of flight. On Wednesday afternoon they found out about Amy Johnson, the first woman to fly solo from England to Australia in 1930. The children then explored different ways to make their own aeroplanes using paper (with some very challenging designs!). They had great fun testing them outside in the rain to see which flew the furthest. Our winning plane travelled 5.8 metres!

# Support your child's reading

Here are some questions you can ask your child to support them with their reading.

A successful reader needs to read at a good pace and with expression. Encourage your child to **re-read** to achieve fluency. Use **Echo reading**-Adult reads with **good expression** and child echoes the sentence back.

#### Retell the story...

Adult: Can you tell me what happened in the story? Child: In the beginning... In the middle... At the end...

#### Characters

Who is a good/bad character in the story? Can you tell me something the character does that tells you this?
Can you tell me something the character says that tells you this?
Child: A good/bad character is\_\_\_. I know they are good/bad because....

#### Characters

Who is your favourite character in the story? Can you describe their personality? Child: My favourite character is \_\_\_\_\_. They are funny/ brave/ clever ( etc) when they\_\_\_\_\_.

#### Setting

Adult: What is the main setting of the story? What other settings are there? Can you find the words used to describe the setting?

#### Problems

Adult: What is the problem in the story?
How is it solved?
Are there any words you don't know the meaning of?

#### Language

Can you find adjectives used in the story?
Can you find verbs with \_\_\_ing \_\_ ed in the story?
Can you find a sentence where the words are really descriptive?

## Non-fiction

What features does the book have that make this non-fiction? How do they help you as a reader? Can you tell me an interesting fact you found out from reading this book?

#### **Positive Quote**
